- <u>Tidewater Training and Technical Assistance Center</u> (TTAC) —
   T-TAC ODU improves educational opportunities for children with developmental delays and disabilities including individuals with intellectual disabilities (through age 21). T-TAC ODU also provides training and support to teachers regarding assistive technology that will assist students with communication needs and provide access to the general education curriculum

There are also supports for more intensive interventions. Start by contacting an early intervention program:

- The Virginia Infant & Toddler Specialist Network (VA- ITSN) Through training, child care providers will learn how to encourage infants and toddlers to express and regulate emotions, solve problems, develop positive relationships and focus on tasks. - Infant & Toddler Connection of Virginia The Infant & Toddler Connection of Virginia is Virginia's early intervention system for infants and toddlers (age 0-36 months) with disabilities and their families. Any infant or toddler in Virginia who isn't developing as expected or who has a medical condition that can delay typical development is eligible to receive early intervention supports and services under Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).

(Services include the Office of Special Education Programs and Part C Early Intervention Programs. DBHDS is the lead agency for Part C in Virginia).
